

PROJECT WEBFOOT WORKING WITH DUCKS UNLIMITED CANADA

[Project Webfoot](#) is an initiative through [Ducks Unlimited](#) that provides students the opportunity to apply their learning and connect with nature through safe, interactive and inspiring educational content both inside and outside the classroom.

Linked directly with grades four through six curriculums, classes participate in hands-on activities, such as bird watching, catching aquatic invertebrates with nets, nature hikes and playing ecological games. This hands-on element of the program gives youth the opportunity to experience wetlands first-hand and instill in them an appreciation for these natural habitats.

Enerplus has been involved with Ducks Unlimited since 1998 and with Project Webfoot since 2013.
